Highways

The winter is now behind us but the damage to our 2,000 miles of Herefordshire roads is evident. The Government has given us an extra million pounds towards the cost of the extra repairs and we have agreed that most of this should be spent on the minor and Unclassified roads. Lady Hawkins High School

The school has just had an Osted and has been classified as a "good school with outstanding features". The full report is on the websites of the school and Osted. Lady Hawkins has currently 446 pupils and has a cluster of four primary schools at Pembridge, Kington, Eardisley and Almeley. The Governors are determined to follow a policy which will take the school to an "outstanding" position, retaining three class groups per year, our six form with the extra year for all students and the continuing strong culture of a community school.

Looking after Children

As well as seeing to the overall welfare and education of the 22,600 children under 16 in the County the Council is also the corporate parent to currently 185 children. As a result of a variety of circumstances these children are vulnerable and need to be cared by the local authority. Most children will be with foster parents paid by the council who do an important job in giving support and stability. Some more complex cases are placed outside the County at a huge financial cost as well as tackling the emotional problems. If you think you would like to consider being a foster parent please contact the Council and find out more. We all need the best start we can in life.

Council Tax Freeze

The Council has taken the Governments offer of a grant to freeze the level of Council Tax at last years level. The Police and Fire have also done the same. Herefordshire Council budget has made over 10 million pounds worth of savings and the staffing levels will be reduced by over 14% with 250 jobs from 1700 full time positions.

Referendum on the parliamentary voting system

On Thursday, May 5, as well as taking part in the local elections to vote councillors onto Herefordshire Council, voters will also be able to take part in the first nationwide referendum for more than 35 years. Voters will be asked to say "yes" or "no" to changing the system used to elect Members of Parliament at our general elections.

The overall responsibility for the referendum lies with the Electoral Commission, although your voting paper will be collected in when you hand in your ballot paper for your local councillor – this could be at your local polling station, or via a postal vote.

The commission is keen that everyone understands what they are voting for in the referendum, so look out for an explanatory booklet they are sending out to every household in the UK.

This booklet will be supported by an advertising campaign – run by the Electoral Commission – and further details can be found on the commission's website – www.electoralcommissiojn.org.uk

If you are not registered to vote, you will not be able to vote in either the local elections or the referendum. To check that you are registered, or if you wish to change your preferred voting arrangements, please contact the electoral registration team on 01432 260107.

The last day for receipt of applications to appoint someone to vote on your behalf (called a proxy vote) is April 21.

GRANTS FOR YOUNG PEOPLE

YouthBank

Grants for Young People by Young People
Over £22,000 has been awarded during the past 2
years by Herefordshire YouthBank. Set up in early 2009
by young people with help from the Herefordshire vinvolved youth work team, it provides small grants of up
to £900 for young people aged 11-25 for their good
ideas in the community.

Not just work...

Decisions on grants are made every month by a panel of volunteers aged 16-25 and there are currently 10 young people who volunteer their free time on the panel. However it is not all hard work.

Volunteers are crucial

Herefordshire YouthBank is one of only two Youth-Bank's in the whole of the West Midlands region and is sustainable because it relies upon volunteers and is not reliant upon government grants or paid staff. The Youth Panel really want to continue this grant giving, particularly with the loss of other funding schemes locally and nationally, so watch this space for future news on more funds. ALL SYSTEMS GO FOR PEMBRIDGE GOOD NEIGHBOUR SCHEME.

Eleven people have stepped forward as volunteers for the scheme and hopefully with funding in place the steering group will be ready in the early summer to start advertising the phone number throughout the area so that anyone requiring help, especially the elderly can use the scheme. The phone number will be made known through the Pembridge News. leaflets and posters in Doctors surgeries etc. A core group of volunteers will hold the scheme's mobile telephone number on a rota basis. They will be backed by a team of volunteers, who will be CRB checked, who will agree to help in one or more ways - things from changing a light bulb, fetching prescriptions, shopping, occasional tidying of a garden or befriending someone who is lonely or new to the area.
