- Verdun Oak –Balfour Beatty has dismantled the tree as it was in a dangerous position. They will likely pick up the cost to fell it as it is on their land.
- 20mph speed limit The project is currently in 6th position out of 112 listings and is expected to be in next year's programme of works. Cllr Phillips has requested roundels at edge of village to be brought to PC for discussion. The speed limit would cover the main road, Bridge street and Bearwood Lane.
- Gigaclear Work on the A44 installing fibre broadband will start w/c 28th September 2020. HGV diversion will be in place via A480.
- Following complaints, Covid closures in market towns are being reversed although 20mph speed are staying in place.
- Request to Herefordshire Council that local parish councils are consulted following proposals for capital investment in the Turnpike site.

The annual inspection didn't highlight any major concerns. Councillors discussed the points for consideration and agreed the risk was low enough at present until the project for new equipment is restarted. Clerk to ensure all recommendations are followed up and implemented where necessary.

57/20. Clocktower Update.

Cllr Rogers provided an update on the proposed the clock tower project. From the quotes received the Cumbria clock company has been instructed to install the new automated winding system. After reviewing the electrical quotations, Townsend electricians in Leominster has been asked to update and install the electric supply to accommodate the winding system and lighting. The clerk investigated the installation of a new power supply to the clocktower from Western Power, but it was decided the costs were too high at present. The installation of a new meter will identify electricity usage for Church to cross charge. Cllr Rogers has also requested prices for new information display boards with lighting and is investigating a donations box and possibilities to display the Bulmer photos on the walls. Cllr Rogers will continue facilitate the upgrade project.

58/20. Report Virtual Herefordshire Council Parish Council Summit.

The clerk had previously forward presentation slides to councillors from the Herefordshire Council Parish summit held virtually on 23rd July 2020. Cllr Pace followed up with a more detailed verbal report highlighting discussions on how Herefordshire parishes initiated and provided support to residents initially and ongoing through the Coronavirus outbreak. There are several options on what to do with the wood including a trunk carving, removal for seating or wood for the millennium meadow or planting another tree in its place. All options were discussed. Parish Council had concerns the trunk may be rotten and carving it may not be a long term solution. Councillors requested further costing for the trunk and root removal to be discussed at next meeting. Clerk to investigate costings. Cllr Phillips to investigate whether Balfour Beatty would remove and costs involved if any.
